PRESENTATION

The Society of Spanish Scientists in Southern Africa (ACE Sur de Africa) brings together approximately 80 Spanish scientists and researchers based in Southern Africa. It was created on December 3, 2019 and is a member of the Network of Societies of Spanish Researchers Abroad (RAICEX, https://raicex.wordpress.com/), together with 18 other similar associations distributed throughout the world that group to more than 4500 Spanish scientists and researchers. ACE South Africa is the only one of them in the entire African continent and, together with Australia (SRAP), one of the two located in the Southern Hemisphere. The association is non-political, non-profit and only pursues scientific, research and cultural purposes.

Also, at the moment, ACE Sur de Africa encompasses researchers based in Angola, Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Maldives, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Zambia and Zimbaue, to bring together Spanish researchers working in those Southern Africa countries.

ACE Sur de Africa intends, among others, to contribute to the exchange of information between the different scientific stakeholders and researchers with interests in South Africa, Spain and the global Southern Africa, increase the public visibility and scientific prestige of its associated members, facilitate access to funding plans, plans to return to Spain and research mobility between the two countries. Likewise, ACE South Africa includes among its objectives greater permeability between the academic-scientific fields and the R&D&I sectors of companies with interests in both countries.

The disciplines represented by our associates at the present time include Pure Mathematics, Spanish and South-African Languages and Literature, Statistical Ecology, Solar Energy and Sustainable Development, Theoretical Physics, Wildlife Conservation, Zoology, Archaeology, Botany, Chemistry, Climate Change, Clinical Psychology, Astronomy and Cosmology, Immunology and Virology (HIV, TB and Covid), Ornithology, Oceanography, Paleontology and Political Science.

Participation in the Erasmus+ BAQONDE Project (2020-2023) is made up of three European universities (University of Salamanca - Spain, Trinity College Dublin - Ireland and University of Groningen RUG - Netherlands) and four South African universities (University of the Western Cape UWC, North-West University NWU, Rhodes University UK and University of KwaZulu-Natal UKZN), being led by the University of Salamanca. BAQONDE attends to one of the national priorities designated by the South African authorities: the development of indigenous African languages as a medium of instruction and as languages of higher academic discourse. In this regard, note the absolute absence in the Spanish Education Space of degree studies in African Languages/Philologies/Literatures, beyond the studies of Arabic Philology, understanding this as a quasi-African language.
